CHAPERONES: We need at least 5 WCPSS registered volunteer chaperones for the competition on 25 September (at least 1 parent per 10 students). Please use the sign up genius so that I can make sure I have seats reserved for you on the bus. We also would love to have as many spectator parents as possible! Audience energy helps both our performance as well as there is an award caption for audience response ☺

UNIFORM: “Plan A” Uniform: 2021 Show Shirts, Black, Silver and Red Coat; Gauntlets; Black Bibbers (Pants); Shako (Hat); Plume; Black Marching Shoes; **Black tall socks**; and guard uniforms.

Please keep in mind that uniforms are meant to make us UNIFORM. Please be FULLY dressed in uniform or fully not in uniform. You are not uniform if you are somewhere in between. Hats may (and should) be taken off in doors. Please arrive to school IN UNIFORM. We will travel to the competition in uniform. Please make sure you check that your entire uniform is put together and packed in your uniform bag before leaving the house. The weather is supposed to be low 50’s to low 60’s. Please dress wisely to stay warm!

EQUIPMENT: Make sure you have everything you need for the entire show. Please remember that once we are an hour away, we can’t go back to the school because you forgot x, y, or z. All equipment (instruments, uniform bags/rack with change of clothes, drum major stand, front ensemble, props, flags, props) will be loaded into the rental truck/trailer. Please make sure and confirm that YOUR equipment is loaded. Please do not rely on someone else (including parents, other students, or teachers) to make sure your needs are loaded. I really want to see our Equipment Crew work hard to get everything loaded in the morning. Parents should be there to help, not to do the work for us.

MUSIC: Guide You Home – Music from Lincolnshire Posy, Wellerman, and Coldplay’s Fix You

MONEY: You will have an opportunity (and are encouraged) to eat after our competition run. Students are encouraged to bring their OWN food. You’ll want to keep it cold too because it will be on the bus during the day. Cary will have concessions as well as vendors which I won’t discourage you from patronizing, but also want you to be smart about what risks you take for health considerations. WCPSS and I encourage you to bring your OWN food. Consider that prices are in general “state fair food” prices and choices. Make sure you eat food and drink water and take care of your body nutritionally.
